

HAMDON YOUTH GROUP

HYG are sad to announce that as from June, it will be necessary to reduce the number of weekly sessions in Stoke from four a month to just one as a result of the reduction in its annual grant from the Parish Council this year. From 5 June 2024 we will be able to run only one session/week as follows:

First, second and fourth Wednesdays in Norton Village Hall Third Wednesday in the Hamdon Youth and Family Centre in Stoke

We have also lost our Youth Worker after 12 years. Youth Workers are in short supply and until a replacement is found there may be times when sessions or venues have to be cancelled and we ask for your understanding.

HYG is a volunteer led charity and has to raise around £18,000 pa to cover fixed costs, mainly for a professional Youth Worker and some Support Workers. They run the weekly sessions, do outreach work at Stanchester School and in the community for those with special needs or who need a listening ear to improve mental health and wellbeing.

HAM HILL COUNTRY PARK – GEO WEEK

This May half-term, Ham Hill is celebrating GeoWeek 2024! Did you know that the beautiful warm golden Hamstone at Ham Hill makes the Park one of the most important geological locations in Somerset? Our story starts 170 million years ago in shallow turbulent seas, when crushed up fragments of shells and other sea creatures sank to the sea floor, mixed with sand and clay. Over millions of years, this hardened under pressure to form the Hamstone that is responsible for Ham Hill's exciting history and the spectacular wildlife that we enjoy on our walks today!

Pop up to the Rangers' Office to collect a Geology Trail leaflet – a self-guided trail that takes you to points of geological interest around the Park.
